Drs. Dakson and Christie present *Percutaneous Vertebral Augmentation for the Treatment of Pathological Fractures of the Spine.* Pathological vertebral fractures (PVFs) occur commonly due to osteoporosis or a metastatic lesion to the spine, and present with acute back pain and loss of independent ambulation. Appropriate clinical assessment and radiographic evaluation are required to ensure optimal patient selection for a percutaneous vertebral augmentation procedure (PVA). This review explores the pathogenesis of PVFs and the efficacy of PVA in improving pain-related outcomes as well as health-related quality of life scores in both osteoporotic and metastatic PVFs.

In his article, *How to Understand and Prevent Knee Injuries in the Female Athlete*, **Dr. Aly Abdulla** briefly reviews knee injuries that are more common in female athletes than in their male counterparts.
